Job Title: Seasonal Weed Crew Hand
Department: Weed Department
Location: Baker, Montana
Job Status: Full-time, Non-Exempt
Reports to: Weed Control Coordinator

Job Overview:

This position uses a variety chemical spray equipment to control identified noxious weeds in Fallon County; this requires extensive outside manual labor in a variety of weather conditions. Participates in regular maintenance of equipment and cleaning of the facility.

This position requires a motor vehicle driving history review.

Essential Functions:

Chemical Spraying – Identifies noxious weeds. Sprays weeds with approved chemicals using established procedures and equipment including but not limited to 4x4 trucks, ATV/UTV's, GPS, pumps, small engines and Personal Protective Equipment. Ensures spraying procedures adhere to weed control rules and regulations by maintaining communication with the Coordinator and other crew hands via training and established written materials. Spray procedures include extensive walking and/or driving.

Equipment Maintenance and Facility Cleaning – Performs regular maintenance on equipment, including checking and/or changing oil and tire pressure. Cleans equipment including washing vehicles. Cleans and organizes the shop.

Competencies:

Adaptability, Attention to Detail, Customer Service, Flexibility, Initiative, Map Reading, Mechanical, Oral & Written Expression, and Record Keeping:

This position requires significant attention to detail in the identification of noxious weeds and subsequent spraying of chemicals. Must possess excellent customer service and interpersonal skills to resolve questions and concerns using good judgment and discretion. Effectively interact with variety of personalities and demands of the public. Resolve questions or concerns with courtesy and respect. Willingness to work beyond routine and scheduled hours. Work independently. Read, understand and utilize maps, aerial photos and GPS equipment. Knowledge of basic tools including purpose, repair and maintenance. Listen to and understand information and ideas presented through spoken words and sentences. Communicate information and ideas in speaking so others will understand. Maintain accurate and neat records of daily chemical applications, as required by State law.

Minimum Qualifications:

Must be a minimum of sixteen (16) years of age; seventeen (17) years of age and older is preferred. A valid Montana driver's license is required. Experience in using a side-by-side and manual transmission is preferred. Knowledge of the identification of noxious weeds and herbicides used in their control is a plus; however, extensive on the job training is provided in both areas.

Employees are encouraged but not required to obtain a governmental applicator license. The Weed Board will cover the expenses to obtain the license and attend training classes. Prior Weed Board approval is required to attend training sessions.

Salary Schedule:

The starting wage for this position is \$12.50 per hour. Experienced and returning seasonal weed crew hands will be paid on the following schedule:

2nd Year: \$13.00 per hour

3rd Year: \$13.50 per hour

4th Year: \$14.00 per hour

5th Year: \$14.50 per hour

6th Year: \$15.00 per hour

7th Year: \$15.50 per hour

8th Year: \$16.00 per hour

**Fallon County Weed Department Endorsement is an additional \$2.00 per hour at any level. Pay increases for obtaining the license will be awarded on the day the test is passed. Experience levels will be determined by the Coordinator.

Hours of Work:

This seasonal position typically works during the summer months; shifts may be up to twelve (12) hours. Schedule is often dependent upon the weather; the needs of the department may result in overtime (in excess of forty (40) hours per week) and will be compensated at time and a half.

Physical and Environmental Demands:

While performing the duties of this job, the employee is regularly required to speak or hear. The employee is frequently required to stand, walk on uneven surfaces, sit, bend, and reach with hands and arms. May be required to climb or balance and stoop, kneel, crouch or crawl. May be required to lift up to fifty (50) pounds. Specific vision abilities include close and distant vision.
