9:00 AM CONVENE

PRESENT William L. Randash, Chairman; **Steve Baldwin** and **Deb Ranum**, Members, **Lani DeBuhr**, Clerk

9AM- COMMISSIONER MEETING

Baker Lake Lower Drainage: Lance Wedemeyer, City of Baker Public Works Director, came in to ask the Commission what they would like him to do in submitting a permit for the bottom of the drainage channel. They discussed having gravel versus concrete in the bottom of channel and the permitting timeline it would entail.

Prince Contracting Rental of Space: The Commission received a voicemail from Mike with Prince Contracting asking if the County would rent out county space for them to store chips they will be using on the highways and to put 10 campers on. Commissioner Ranum agreed to rent the space to store chips but not allow campers. The Commission said they don't want to infringe on the local campsite businesses that have vacancies right now. There are a lot of spaces right now for campers that they can use and pay for. The Commission also wants the contract to specify they will not be allowed to sublease the land. The Commission discussed what to charge for rent. Commissioner Randash stated he didn't want the rent to be too high as the company is doing improvements to the area. Commissioner Baldwin & Commissioner Ranum said that may be true but the dollars they are earning for the work will not be spent in Fallon County so they are offering little benefit other than the road for the taxpayers. They suggested charging them a commercial rate for the use of the space. The Commission set the rental amount for \$2,000 per month. Commissioner Randash called and told Mike the rent amount and specifications of contract. The Commission will have Darcy draft a rental agreement up.

New Seasonal Employees: The Commission signed New Hire Approval Forms for the Weed, Golf and Fair seasonal employees for the 2015 Summer Season.

Rifle Range Fencing: Commissioner Ranum talked to Mike Kirschten, Rifle Range Board Chairman, and asked him to get quotes from Rieger Fencing and Gene Vennes for the fencing at the Rifle Range.

9:50am: Debbie Wyrick, Deputy Clerk & Recorder joined the meeting.

Debbie asked the Commission if there was water damage in the Road Building that leaked last week. She is wondering if an insurance claim needs to be submitted. Commissioner Ranum said Richard Griffith with Griffith Steel is coming over to pull the panels out and see if there is damage and where it is coming from. Debbie said she will wait until Richard looks at it before deciding if a claim needs to be submitted.

9:55am- Debbie Wyrick left the meeting.

10AM- SHOP & ROAD UPDATES, Alba Higgins; Shop Foreman, Bobby Wiedmer; Road Foreman

SHOP UPDATES:

MAC 140: The suspension is done and clutch needs to be done next.

MAC 139: A set of trunions has been ordered for it.

MAC 213: It is still up in Billings. They will use the MAC 160 for a backup if needed.

Pickup Toolbars: Six of the new toolbars are in and they are waiting on the other 3. Auto Advantage asked if they should install them or if the Road Department would install them. The Commission would like the Road Department to install them.

Blades: Alba is working on replacing tires on the Snowpatrol and Motorpatol and will continue looking at what other ones need to be changed out for the upcoming fiscal year.

Loader 15: When it comes in they will replace the broken glass.

Barrels: The new barrels haven't come in yet. They are getting cross contamination in the barrels so Alba ordered additional barrel pumps to use as well.

Landfill Equipment: Electronic injectors and overhead need to be reset in the loader. Alba is going to see if Tractor & Equipment can come down and do the work. The Landfill scraper is going to be brought into shop to be serviced.

Roller Packer: Alba will get the packer ready for the City to use.

Health Nurse Vehicle: Mitch replaced the water pump on Friday.

Chuck Lee's Pickup: Bringing it into shop to service it.

Victor's Expedition: Replaced the alternator pulley on his vehicle.

Mower Tractor: Replaced alternator on tractor.

Air Conditioning: Pickups are having issues with air conditioning, Alba & Mitch are working on this.

Road Department Roof: Commissioner Ranum asked Alba to let them know when Richard Griffith comes to take a look at the roof that leaked.

ROAD UPDATES:

Chips: Commissioner Randash asked Bobby if he needs or wants some chips for the roads and Bobby said he usually gets them from Glendive.

Millings: Bobby talked to Mark from the State about the millings west of Wibaux that are available. He told Bobby the millings were hard and he would need to bring a good loader. Commissioner Randash asked him if he was obligated to get these millings as it may be more work than it's worth. Bobby said he is under no obligation to take them. Commissioner Ranum asked Bobby to go look at the millings before taking a loader to get them. Bobby said he could do that.

Gazebo Parking Lot: Bobby said there is water coming from under the pavement and making the pavement very soft. The heavy trucks on the pavement are damaging the road too as it wasn't designed to have heavy trucks on it. Bobby said if trucks continue to use that road to haul dirt & millings the road will be destroyed and have to be redone. Bobby suggested not allowing the heavy trucks to use the road but instead they could come in from another direction. Commissioner Randash asked Commissioner Baldwin to contact Gamut Construction about not having their trucks drive on that road.

Bobby said the Road Department could take their track hoe to dig up the parking lot but suggested hiring someone to do it. Commissioner Ranum agreed and said she would like someone else to do the project completely if the road department can't do all of it. Commissioner Randash asked if they should just have Griffith Excavating do all the work per their quote and is wondering if they could get it done prior to the car show if they call them today. Bobby said he wasn't sure but suggested waiting until July to do it so they aren't fighting the mud. In July the millings from Glendive would be warm and easier to break up too. Bobby said when the work is done he wants to make sure they lay fabric down first to act as a water barrier and he could supply the fabric since it wasn't in the quote. Commissioner Baldwin said waiting until later in the summer is a good idea and at that time the City may have millings left over from their projects for the County to use. Commissioner Randash asked Bobby to get a hold of Griffith Excavating to put it on their schedule to do the work later in the summer. Bobby said half of the Gazebo parking lot should be roped off to keep trucks and cars off of it but the rest of the parking lot would be sufficient for the Car Show as that part alone is as big as the hospital's parking lot. Commissioner Baldwin called Tracy Bruha to let her know the Car Show could still be at the gazebo parking lot but that half of the parking lot would be roped off and Tracy said that would be fine.

Bobby said getting the cold mix has been delayed but when it is received they will put it on the gazebo road, giving it a 3-4 inch lift. He said it should adhere well as it would just go straight onto the pavement. Commissioner Baldwin told Bobby to check with Scott Rabbit, Parks Director, before doing anything to the roads as Scott is planning on eliminating or changing some of the roads once Iron Horse Park is complete.

Oil Tanker: Alba asked the Commission to think about what they may want to do with the oil tank trailer the Road Department has and never uses. Commissioner Ranum asked if specs could be drawn up and it could be put up for sale to the public. Commissioner Baldwin wasn't sure it could be sold outside of the County Auction but will ask Darcy Wassman, County Attorney, to make sure.

10:45am- Bobby Wiedmer & Alba Higgins left the meeting.

11AM-CLOSED/PERSONNEL, Julie Straub; Human Resource Manager, **Scott Rabbit;** Parks Director, **Clayton Hornung;** City of Baker Mayor.

Commissioner Ranum called for a meeting with Scott Rabbit to discuss his wages and performance. She told Scott and Clayton she is concerned Scott's wages are higher than County wages for the same type of work. Scott said he did the research on what he is paid by the City versus what County employees in the Road, Weed and Golf Departments are paid and he is right in the middle. Clayton said the City has its own pay scale and Scott is on the right scale in comparison to other employees and hasn't been given any higher raises than the others. Clayton reminded the Commission that Scott's rate of pay and the pay scale increase he would receive were what the County and City agreed to when he was hired. Commissioner Ranum asked Clayton if the City has the right to increase Scott's wages without County involvement. Clayton said the County has the right to be a part of that process but hasn't in recent years. Commissioner Ranum asked Clayton if he knew when Scott's job performance was last evaluated by the County and Clayton said the last time was in

2008. Commissioner Ranum said she cannot support any future wage increases for Scott. Scott said he is frustrated because when he was hired his pay rate was less than a County employee hired for that type of work but now that he has had several years in with the City and his yearly increases have caused him to surpass other county employees there is an issue. He said that if he had originally been hired at a County rate and given the longevity of a County employee over the years his pay would be higher than it is now. He gave the example of Eric Kary, Golf Course Supervisor's pay at the Golf Course: Eric earns \$29.63/hour, not including his longevity pay where Scott is earning \$26.90. Commissioner Randash said he doesn't think Scott's wages are too high. Clayton said he is comfortable with the pay rate Scott is at and that the parks are a testament of his work ethic and that he should continue to receive yearly raises in accordance with the City's set pay scale. Commissioner Ranum said she would like to look at Scott's job description as it relates to his County duties. Julie Straub, Human Resource Manager, asked Commissioner Ranum if she would like to be a part of Scott's yearly evaluation and Commissioner Ranum said yes, she feels that is the right thing to do since the County pays half of his wages.

Julie said Scott's wages are right in the middle of other County employees and thinks the stronger issue is the lack of communication between Scott and the Commission. Commissioner Ranum said it wasn't only a communication problem but also a respect problem. Commissioner Baldwin thinks there is a lack of communication and that some of the discord stems from Scott spending money without letting the Commission know prior to purchases being made. Commissioner Ranum said the rule is that any spending over \$1,000 has to have Commission pre-approval and that Scott doesn't follow that rule. She said he just buys stuff like buying the landscape rocks for Iron Horse Park. Scott said the rocks were in the original budget for the project, didn't think he needed to get approval.

Commissioner Ranum asked Scott if he uses County equipment for work he does for the City. Scott says yes and vice versus, he often uses City equipment for County work too. Scott said he works on the parks as a whole, he doesn't look at them separately such as County & City. He said if he has done things incorrectly he is sorry but he has always had the parks best interest in mind.

Commissioner Ranum asked Scott how the bleachers ended up at Clayton Graham's over the winter. Scott said he was asked if they could be used by Clayton and he said he could, didn't think it was an issue. Commissioner Ranum asked Scott if he received dirt from Clayton in return for letting him use the bleachers and Scott said no he didn't. Commissioner Ranum asked him where he got all the dirt for his projects and Scott said he is getting it from the city and leftover projects. Commissioner Baldwin asked if Scott ever makes any type of "deals" with other companies. Scott said no he doesn't although he does help other organizations like the Chamber set up things but doesn't receive anything in return.

Commissioner Ranum asked Scott about the large amount of fertilizer in his storage shed. She said the County is in need of storage space and doesn't think that much fertilizer should be stored "in house" as the space could be used to store other things. Scott said he purchases the fertilizer in the fall with other chemicals because you get a discount. Commissioner Ranum asked where he stores the city's fertilizer. Scott said he purchases fertilizer as needed from Ace due to a restricted budget so no storage is needed.

Commissioner Ranum asked Scott what he stores in the building behind the gazebo. Scott said various things such as shovels, supplies and irrigation pipes and the Commission is welcome to have a key to go look at it. Scott said he will give a copy of key to Commissioner Ranum to look at storage building behind gazebo.

Commissioner Ranum asked Scott if he has a maintenance plan for his equipment. Scott said yes, he has a maintenance log that he uses to keep track of the maintenance of his equipment so they last as long as possible.

Commissioner Ranum asked about Scott's tree purchases and a tree that is uprooted. She asked Scott to tighten the nuts & bolts on the playground equipment at the parks. Scott said when seasonal help starts it will free him up to do that. Commissioner Randash suggested keeping an eye on his summer help a little better so they use their time wisely. Scott said he has struggled with that from time to time and plans on working on it this year. He said there are things that he doesn't want them to do due to the experience needed for job.

Julie asked the Commission if they would like Scott to update them on a regular basis and maybe start meeting with them initially once a week for 15 minutes to get the communication going in the right direction. This would be a time they could discuss expenditures, duties and anything else that may come up. Scott said he could start doing "Park Progress Reports" for the Commission too. Julie asked Lani DeBuhr, Clerk, to set up the first month of 15 minute sessions with Scott and then

after that it could maybe be spread out to once a month meetings. Julie told Clayton he was welcome to join the meetings but it isn't necessary. Clayton said he would try to come and is concerned about Scott becoming micromanaged. Commissioner Baldwin & Commissioner Randash said they do not want that to be the case. Julie asked Commissioner Ranum if there was anything else she wanted to discuss before the meeting ended. Commissioner Ranum said there was an instant where Scott was yelling at her over the phone to the point Darcy Wassman, County Attorney, could hear him and she does not want that type of behavior to continue. She said the other things she wants to make sure start happening is to not spend over \$1000 without approval and to keep them informed about what is going on. Julie said she is hopeful the regular meetings will help with these issues.

1:30pm- Commissioner Baldwin made the motion to accept the bid from Thiel Bros. Roofing. Commissioner Ranum seconded the motion. 3 Ayes. 0 nays. Motion carried unanimously.

The Commission asked Brenda Wood to draft letters to each of the Companies who submitted a bid proposal to notify them of their choice.

PURCHASE APPROVALS:

The Commission approved purchasing a Smart Display Board for the Commissioners' Office. It will be purchased from T.E.S.T for the purpose of viewing GIS maps and other interactive modules with the public as needed.

PROJECT UPDATES- Dwayne Bohle, Special Projects:

South Sandstone Project: Eastside & Westside has had no leveling or seeding done.

Rifle Range-Landscaping around building and hauling in fill dirt. Continuing to work on floors & bathrooms. **Iron Horse Park:** Landscaping & hauling in fill dirt. Prepping ground for sidewalk installation. **Fairgrounds Cold Storage:** Installing inner wall protection barriers on west side, the east side is complete. **Fairgrounds Big Barn:** Installing electrical outlets, siding & new doors.

ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS-

Bonnievale Road, Sandstone Creek Bridge Replacement: The Commission was notified by a letter dated 05/08/2015 the Army Corp of Engineers reviewed the MT Joint Application to replace the existing deficient Kramlick Bridge over Milk Creek with a double 10 foot wide by 8 foot high precast concrete box culvert and to construct a temporary bypass road over Milk Creek with it being 24 feet wide with 3:1 side slopes. The Corps provided a preliminary jurisdictional determination for the project.

NAPA Retaining Wall: The Commission was notified by a letter dated 05/07/2015 the Army Corp of Engineers reviewed the MT Joint Application to remove an existing concrete retaining wall and replace it with a new block retaining wall to be constructed in same location. The letter stated a DA permit would not be required for this project and provided the MT DEQ CWA Section 401 water quality certification for the project.

AGREEMENTS:

Intergovernmental Agreement: The Commission signed the State of MT Intergovernmental Agreement for the Transfer of Monies to the State of Montana Department of Public Health & Human Services, Senior and Long Term Care for Fiscal Year 2015.

Task Order: The Commission signed the Task Order 16-07-5-01-013-0 to Fallon County Unified Governmental Master Contract for period 07/01/2012-06/30/2019 enabling Maternal and Child Health Services to be provided to residents of Fallon County.

MISCELLANEOUS:

County Equipment: The Commission received a copy of a letter dated 05/11/2015 from Tom Muckle, Fire Chief, specifying the protocol to be used when Fallon County road equipment is used for fire containment and/or suppression. The Commission reviewed the letter, Commissioner Ranum recommended changes be made to include the Commission be notified when County Equipment is loaned out for fires. Lani DeBuhr, Clerk, will contact Tom to make the changes.

Board Member Notifications: The Commission received copies of the letters mailed out by Brenda Wood, Clerk & Recorder, to Fallon County Board Members whose terms are expiring.

3:00PM- PUBLIC COMMENT

3:25pm- Darcy Wassman, County Attorney, joined the Public Comment meeting

Dispatchers: Darcy said she is still looking to see if a contract exists between the dispatchers and the County that specifies the wage and Sheriff Retirement System (SRS) benefits they agreed to when the dispatcher's left the union. Darcy said even if the SRS is specified in the contract the County may not

have any control over it as the SRS sets the requirements to be a part of their program, not the County. The Commission told Darcy about the idea to keep the current dispatchers in “detention officer” status so they can keep the higher pay and benefits but not offering the “detention officer” duties and higher pay to new employees. Darcy said she doesn’t think you can separate the “detention officer” dispatchers from the “non-detention officer” dispatchers in order for the current employees to continue to keep their higher pay and retirement. Darcy said she is working on determining what can be done to solve this problem. Commissioner Baldwin asked Darcy to find out for sure if the hiring of 4 detention officers would jeopardize the Sheriff Department’s ability to not be obligated to pay officers over time. There is a statute that allows Sheriff Departments with a law enforcement staff under 5 to base their “overtime” pay on a monthly basis rather than a weekly basis. This makes it where an officer can work over 40 hours but not accrue overtime as long as they don’t accrue over 160 hours per month. This statute is in place to protect Counties from not incurring excessive overtime pay due to the nature of officers having to be called out frequently in addition to their normal work schedule. Commissioner Baldwin said Trent doesn’t think the additional officers would put his Department over the “5” number as detention officers are not “sworn in” law enforcement. Commissioner Baldwin said he would like Darcy to research it and have an answer back no later than Monday, May 18th, 2015.

Board Secretaries: The Commission asked Darcy if it is legal to pay a secretary to do administrative duties for a volunteer board. The County has no other board that pays for a secretary except the Airport. Now that Ve Abrams is no longer the secretary for the Airport Board they are wanting to hire someone to take her place. The Commission is concerned if this is legal or fair as no other boards have a paid secretary. Commissioner Randash said they are also concerned that if they agree to hire a secretary for the Airport Board all the other County Boards will want one and it wouldn’t be a good use of taxpayer money. Darcy said she will have to research it and suggested the Commission to advise the Airport Board to find a volunteer to do their administrative duties.

Renting of space to Prince Contracting: The Commission asked Darcy to draft a contract between Fallon County and Prince Contracting for the use of County space to store their chips. They told Darcy to make sure the contract specifies no sub-leasing or campers/RVs on the space.

District Court Judge Huss: Commissioner Ranum asked Darcy what the process is for replacing Judge Huss now that he is resigning. Darcy said the Governor will appoint a committee that will work together to give him recommendations for a replacement.

Board of Investments: Commissioner Ranum asked Darcy to do research on the County forming a Board of Investments to oversee and guide the investments being made on behalf of Fallon County. Commissioner Ranum said it is hard to believe the County has boards for all kinds of things but not one for investing.

Closed Meetings: Darcy said she is concerned about meetings being “closed” without warrant. Darcy said a meeting should only be closed if privacy matters outweigh the public’s right to know. She also said the person who is being discussed in a closed meeting has the right to know and request the meeting to be opened or closed. If they want it open, the County would have to make the meeting open. She said the only person who can declare the meeting closed is the Board Chairman, which now is Commissioner Randash. Commissioner Baldwin asked if the other Commissioners could call for a meeting and she said yes they could but would have to notify the public. Darcy said if a person is being discussed in a Human Resource meeting they should be notified and given the opportunity to hear what is being said about them. The Commission said Julie Straub, Human Resource Manager, is the one who directs the Commission if a Human Resource meeting should be open or closed as she has to ensure the County is abiding by the State rules regarding employee management & privacy. The Commission will have Julie contact Darcy to discuss this matter in more depth.

Commissioner Agenda: Darcy said the Commission Agendas are not specific enough. She said the agenda should have more detail on what is being discussed so it meets the “informing the public” requirement. Lani DeBuhr, Clerk, will start making the agenda more specific.

Jail Coverage: Commissioner Ranum said the Sheriff’s Department is having a hard time covering the jail and wants to hire 4 new detention officers. She thinks the City and the County could work together to get jail coverage. She said there are enough officers between the two entities to cover the jail. Commissioner Baldwin said that may be the case but Montana Statute dictates how much coverage the County needs to have for their jail and the County is responsible for meeting those requirements. The Commission asked Darcy if there is a state statute that says the county jail has to serve as a city jail. The Commission thinks there should be some cost sharing between the City and County for the inmates. Darcy said she will research this.

Fidelity Lease: The Commission and Darcy discussed the terms of Fidelity’s lease with the county for using 1.84 acres of County land to store things such as tanks and barrels on. The Commission said

Fidelity has been using that land for free over the last 20 years but thinks they should be charging them an amount to lease it. Darcy said she can draft a contract for this and Commissioner Baldwin will contact Jason Bechtold to let him know about it.

Attorney Workload: Darcy said she is going to get caught up on County stuff but has had a lot of criminal things she has been working on. Darcy asked the Commission for a County computer to do her County work on. The Commission said they would talk to Don Dilworth, IT Tech, to get a computer purchased for her. The Commission asked Darcy to start meeting with them every other Monday for an hour to discuss the status of things she is working on and things the Commission may need her to do.
